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When PLEAA re-signed the Shoshone Trail system it became clear, in a hurry:

- we needed a way to carry tools, equipment, and materials for the job onto the trail
- a conventional trailer worked, but not very well on one outing we scattered carsonite posts over miles of trail
- whatever we developed needed to be able to navigate narrow and rough trails and terrain
- it would make more sense if the trailers COULD be used for other trail projects As ideas evolved, we also realized the project would take more funding than we had available. The trailers you see below are the result of this process and funding largely by a FIG Grant. [click here for FIG grant info]




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
The Redi-driver box, Carsonite Storage Tube and Tiedowns



The Carsonite Storage Tube is made from 8" PVC tube with a glued on cap at the nose and a threaded cap (which is not in the illustration).

Redi-driver storage box
The box is ¾" thick molded plastic and I feel it is a must. It is my intention to have the lid open down so the carsonites can be loaded in the tube more easily.
